FOREWORD

This Lott Book grows out of work done by Dr. Robert Furman in preparation for a book on the Phillips Family of New Jersey. It was found that the names Phillips and Lott came together in so many places that it seemed desirable to know more about the Lott Family in order better to understand their various relationships with the Phillips Family. An early instance of this combining Lott and Phillips is found on page 188 of "Cooley" where it is assumed that William Phillips born 1702 was son of Joseph married twice, one wife being a Miss Lott.

We had to abolish this Joseph, as it required too great a stretch of imagination to believe that there were two separate Phillips families as shown by "Cooley" as follows:

And we found that by all the evidence William Phillips born 1702 is the son of Theophilus born 1673; and also that Miss Lott fits in perfectly as the wife (not the mother) of William Phillips born 1702. This also explains the introduction of the Lot, Lott name into the Phillips family.

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INTRODUCTION

There are few families, that the compiler has worked on where there are so many conflicting statements, and where, so much material has been put together with little or no actual proof.

The difficulties, as a whole, are due to the duplication of given names, in each generation, also to the fact, that most genealogical work done, has been on one line of descent back, without regard to collateral lines.

We have tried to work out certain Phillips-Lott connections, and for this, a great deal of work has been done, both on the Long Island, and New Jersey records, in the endeavor to establish the various inter-marriages, but only the following have been found, or indicated:-

- 1. ANN, ANNA, ANNATJE LOT, LOTT, daughter of Peter and Nishe Lot, Lott, married Justice John Phillips, of Pleasant Valley, N.J., son of Theophilus and Frances Phillips. He appears as an Executor of the will of Peter Lot, Dec. 11, 1720, proved April 17, 1721, Hopewell, N.J., and is named "son John Phillips," in this will. Justice John and Ann (Lot, Lott) Phillips, had children whose names are distinctly Lott names Peter, Henry, Katy (Katherine), Marytje (Mary) Phillips, bapt. Sept. 19, 1739, Readington Church, N.J.
- 2. JOHN LOT PHILLIPS, Cordova, Ill. Son of Thomas and Catherine (Phillips) Phillips, great-grandson (on the maternal side) of William Phillips, b. 1702, and his wife Mary, whom I believe was MARY LOT, daughter of Peter and Nishe Lot, Lott. This Peter Lot signed his name with one "t", and this spelling has been used in this branch.
- 3. REV. JOHN LOTT PHILLIPS, born in Philadelphia, Pa., degree of B.A. Princeton, 1774, got land at St. Margaret Parish, Wake County, N.C., a gift of his relative Mrs. Phoebe Warner, of Princeton, N.J. Went to England, where he died. This man was a Tory, but neither his Phillips, nor Lott antecedents are known. Lotts, from Long Island and New Jersey, moved to various sections of Pennsylvania, at an early date.
- 4. JOSEPH PHILLIPS, Cooley in his "Genealogies of the first settlers of Ewing and Trenton, N.J." page 188, says "the ancestor of one branch of the Phillips Family, emigrated from Wales to Long Island, thence to Maidenhead, N.J. He was twice married, one wife being a Miss LOTT, and he had children by each wife." A search of Long Island and New Jersey records, fails to show such a marriage, or connection.
- 5. KEZIAH PHILLIPS, married Sept. 26, 1768, GERSHOM LOTT, of Perth Amboy, N.J., John Phillips appeared on the marriage bonds. In 1777, when Gershom Lott died, Ralph Phillips, and Keziah Lott, were made executors. Later we find their children with a combination of Phillips-Lott names William Phillips Lott, Dr. Ralph Phillips Lott.
- 6. LETITIA PHILLIPS, married RICHARD LOTT, son of Peter, and grandson of Peter and Nishe Lot, Hopewell, N.J.

- 7. LOT, LOTT PHILLIPS, born about 1741; died 1780, married Jan. 17, 1770, Hannah Hart. He was in my opinion, son of William Phillips, b. 1702, and his wife MARY LOT, LOTT, daughter of Peter and Nishe Lot.
- 8. LOTT PHILLIPS, son of Peter, and grandson of Justice John and Ann, Anna, Annatje (Lot, Lott) Phillips, was born about 1754; died 1820; married Elizabeth Titus.
- 9. MARY LOTT, 2nd wife of WILLIAM PHILLIPS, born Nov. 13, 1722; died Aug. 5, 1806. She died June 28, 1796.
- 10. MARY LOT, LOTT, who I believe was one of the five unnamed children in the will of Peter Lot, who had wife Nishe. Mary married William Phillips, born Jan. 7, 1702; died Jan. 3, 1776, Maidenhead, N.J., son of Theophilus and Frances Phillips, and brother of Justice John Phillips.
- 11. THOMAS LOT PHILLIPS, New Castle, Pennsylvania, son of Elijah and Christiana (Brooks) Phillips, great-great-grandson of William and Mary (Lot, Lott) Phillips.

There are other indications of close relationships between the Phillips and Lott families. The will of William Hunt, of Hopewell, N.J., made March 19, 1781, mentions "grandchildren, RUTH PHILLIPS, PETER and NAOMI LOTT." This is just a start, in time we hope these connections may be more clearly and definitely established.

A Coat-of-Arms of the Lott family, the original of which including the name of Abraham Lott, and used by him as a Bookplate, is pasted in a Holland Heidelbergh catachism of 1739, in which is subscribed the name of Gertrude Coyeman, wife of said Abraham, which has passed from generation to generation in the family, and was in possession of the Hon. John A. Lott, whose great-grandfather was a brother of said Abraham Lott.

ORIGIN OF THE LOTT FAMILY IN AMERICA

Peter Lott (written "Lot" by himself, and his son Peter, and "Lott" by his sons Engelbart and Abraham, and "Lodt," "Loth," and "Loot" by some contemporary writers), the common ancestor of the Lott Family of Long Island, and New Jersey, erroneously supposed by some to have been an Englishman by birth, emigrated in 1652, probably in company with Bartel Engelbartsen Lot, who is entered, Dec. 16, 1662, on the marriage records of the Reformed Dutch Church, of New Amsterdam, as "Bartel Engelbartszen Loth, from Reynerwout," or Ruinerwold, a village in the province of Drenthe, in the Netherlands.

They were probably brothers, for Bartel in writing his name, omitted the Engelbartsen, and wrote simply "Bartel Lot," and Peter, in naming his eldest son, Engelbart, has perpetuated the name of Bartel's, if not of his own father, in the family. They both settled in Flatbush, where July 28, 1653, "Bartel Lot and Peter Loot" purchased of Edward Griffin 25 morgens of land on the west side of the road, next to the Minister's (Dominie Polhemius's) land No. 9, as conveyed to said Griffin by Garret Stryker. However, Bartel, later moved to Staten Island, where he died.

James Riker Esq., the author of the "Annals of Newtown" in a letter Sept. 7, 1847, to T. G. Bergen, thought it "probable that the name of Lott was derived from Lotte, a village and parish in "Tecklenburgh, in the old German circle of Westphalia." He says: "Engelbart, too was a German, rather than a Holland name. The affinity between the people of Westphalia and the Swedes, may account for the removal of Engelbart Lott, son of Peter, sometimes subsequent to the year 1674, to the Swedish community of New Castle, on the Delaware. Here Engelbart Lott purchased a large tract of land on Christiana Creek, which he owned till 1707."

From the name of Bartel Engelbartsen Lot, as written by himself, hereinfore referred to, the customary inference would be that Bartel was the baptismal or given name, and Engelbartsen his partronymic, he being the son of Engelbart, and that Lot was his family name, probably derived from the place of his birth, or the old family residence. Teunis Gisbertse Bogaert is an instance of this kind, Gisbertse being the patronymic, and Bogaert the family name, probably derived from the family at one period having residence in a boogaard or orchard. It is possible, but hardly probable, that Bartel Engelbartsen Lot should mean Bartel, son of Engelbart, and grandson of Lodivicus or Lodewick. Bartel's emigrating from Rynerwout is not positive evidence of his being born there, for he may have removed to said village from the locality of his birth. The above arguments are identical with ideas held by Mr. Riker.

On the other hand the Hon. Henry C. Murphy (one time U.S. Minister to New Netherlands), supposed Lott or Lodt most probably to be an abbreviation of Lodivicus, that in the case of Peter Lot or Lodt, as written by himself, and son Peter it meant Peter, son of Lodivicus, and that persons of the name Lott are frequently met with in the Netherlands, whose names are thus derived.

In addition to Bartel and Peter, there appears to have been a Lambert Lott in this country at an early period, a soldier, to whom, April 11th, 1656, permission was given to enlist another man in his place, and leave was granted to return to the fatherland. Another early settler, was Jan (John) Loots, who in 1695, had

a patent of land, in Bergen county, N.J., in Oct. 12, 1695, the Hackinsack Reformed Dutch Church records his marriage, as follows:- "married Jan Loots y.m. born Narrits, in old England, and Hilletje Pauwels, widow of Lubbert Westervelt." In 1728, Dec. 27, he made his will, "John Loots of Hackinsack, Bergen county, farmer. Wife Helena - children, Johannes, Paulus, Tryntje, Geesje, daughter-in-law (step-daughter) Aeltje Westervelt."

Erroneous "Family Tradition," which is printed in "Early Friends Families of Upper Bucks county, Pa.," C. V. Roberts, pages 362/4, has caused considerable confusion, because of its widespread acceptance. Roberts says:

"The Lott family, to which the late Dr. Charles F. Lott of Quakertown belonged, was founded in America by Sarah Lott, a widow, and her five sons, who emigrated to America from England about 1760 and settled on Long Island. Tradition relates that they were of Holland Dutch ancestry, though coming to America from England. The descendants of Sarah Lott intermarried with many of the old Knickerbocker families of New York and some of them, including Adam Mott, Rev. Nathaniel Greene, acquired notable distinction.

"Peter Lott, one of the five sons of Sarah Lott, was born in England, and came to America with his widowed mother, when a child. He was reared on Long Island, but after his marriage lived at Perth Amboy, N.J."

It has been variously stated that Sarah Lott, above was nee Mott, and again that she married second Adam Mott. The truth of the Lott-Mott connection, shows that there was no tie-up between the early Lotts-Motts, except the following:- "Adam Mott, a tailor, of Cambridge, England, aged 29, together with his second wife Sarah, aged 31, with four children by a former wife, and one daughter of his wife Sarah, whose name, singularly enough was Lott, came over in the ship 'Defence' July 1635." From this record, has sprung the family tradition, that Sarah Lott-Mott, was ancestress of the Lott family of Long Island and New Jersey.

I believe that the Lott-Mott Tradition was probably introduced into this family, when Peter Lott, who died 1762, married Mary Mott, daughter of Gershom Mott. This Peter, son of Peter and Catharine Lott, of Perth Amboy, N.J., was the ancestor of Dr. Charles F. Lott.

The St. Nicholas Society of New York (Genealogical Record, Vol. 4, page 185), says that the common ancestor of this family, was a French Huguenot, who emigrated from a point near the Lotte river in the year 1652, and settled in Flatbush, Kings county, N.Y., and this is probably correct.

However, that the Lot family were well established in Amsterdam, Holland, at an early period cannot be ignored, as Rietstap's "Inst. Heraldique Universal," Vol. 4 L Plate XCII, shows the coat-of-arms:- "De sa a la bande d'argent," and LOT was the early spelling of the name in this country, of the family we deal with.

Let us hope that those truly interested, will use the foregoing merely as a basis for further, and future work.

Mr. William Adolf Lott, 621 Arlington Ave., Westfield, N.J., son of Louis and Emilie (Stiegler) Lott, writes "my father Louis Lott and uncle Frederick Lott came to America from Bischweiler, Alsace about 1880, their Father, I believe was Henri Lott, and he came earlier. A Great Uncle had to flee France when Napoleon went down, and he settled a branch of the family in the French districts of Louisiana. (This latter Family Tradition.)

- 2. PETER LOT¹ (also spelled Lodt, Loot, Loth and Lott), the common ancestor of the family in America, was a French Huguenot, who emigrated from a point near the Lotte river, in the year 1652, and settled in Flatbush, Kings county, N.Y.

He married GERTRUDE, possibly Lamberts (n3), who died 1704; both members of the Flatbush Reformed Dutch Church in 1677. He obtained Jan. 25, 1662, a Patent for 24 Morgens of land in Flatbush, which he sold March 22, 1674, to Jan Cornelise Boomgaert. His name appears on Governor Dongan's Patent of Flatbush in 1685, of which town he was a Magistrate in 1656, and 1673, and where he took Oath of Allegiance 1687.

From a map on file in the Office of the Secretary of State in Albany, N.Y., made by "Ja. Cortelyou, sworn surveyor," filed Aug. 8, 1681, of six farms in Flatbush, it appears that "Pieter Lott" owned a farm on the west side of the "highway to the ferry" south of Dominie Polhemius's double lot and north of that of "Klyn Dirk" (Dirk Janse Hoogland) (n4), "broad before 26 Rod 8 foot" (about 311.2 ft English measure), "after 27 Rod" (about 325.8 ft English measure), "long 600 Rod" (about 7241 ft English). This is clearly the lot which Edward Griffen conveyed to "Bartel Lot and Peter Loot," known as No. 9, next to the pastor's (Dominie Polhemius's) land, containing 24 morgens, and now or late the property of Sarah, wife of John Ditmas and daughter of Andrew Suydam.

Signed his name "Peter Lot" and "Peter Lodt." (n5) (Ref: 4:302; 46:185; 73:192)

nl. In the original records this name is spelled ENGELBERT, and ENGELBART, throughout I have used the earlier form, and not Englebart, except in Engelbart #3.

n2. Bartel Engelbertszen Loth, Engelbertszen, Dutch for his father's given name. Although considerably younger than Peter Lot, it would seem that these two emigrant ancestors, were brothers.

n3. Gerritje Lamberts, stood sponsor with Peter Loth at the baptism of Bartel Engelbertszen Loth's daughter Anna Maria, Jan. 4, 1668. It was customary for Dutch women to be listed under their maiden names in the Dutch Records.

n4. Peter Lott was a defendant in an ejectment suit brought by Dirck Jansen Hooglandt in the Court of Sessions at Gravesend. This suit was of several years' standing before it was finally settled by arbitration. Peter Lott eventually winning the suit.

n5. American Families of Historic Lineage, by Pelletreau, claims Peter Lott, the 1st settler is one and the same man whose will was proved June 4, 1730, leaving wife Sarah. This can be thoroughly discounted, as the will of Peter Lott, of Trenton, N.J., made Feb. 27, 1755, and proved May 6, 1755, shows.

- *3. i. Engelbart, d. April 30, 1730, Flatbush, L.I., m. Oct. 27, 1678, Cornelia de la Noy, dau. of Abraham de la Noy.
- *4. ii. Catrina, m. Sept. 22, 1687, Douwe Jansen Van Ditmarsen, who died prior to 1755, son of Jan Jansen and Adrienna Van Ditmarsen.

Dec. 16, 1662. Bartel Engelbertszen Loth, j. m. Van Reynerwout (n6) in Drent en Harmantje Barents j. d. Van Reynerwout, married at the Reformed Dutch Church, New Amsterdam.

He lived in Richmond county, Staten Island, and on April 10, 1708, he was "lately deceased, intestate," and "Letters of Administration were granted to his only son. Engelbert." (N.Y.S.W. 7:486)

1663. July 28. Edward Griffen conveyed to "Bartel Lot and Pieter Loot" bouwery No. 9, in "Midwout," next to the Pastor's land, 600 Rods in length and 24 in breadth, long 24 morgens, as per book G.G. in Office of the Secretary of State, Albany, N.Y. 1665. He appears to have resided in Bergen, N.J., where a "Barthel Lott" took Oath of Allegience. 1670. Harmantje, his wife, joined the Reformed Dutch Church in New York. Signed his name "Bartel Lot." (Ref: 4:302; 24:102)

SECOND GENERATION

3. ENGELBART LOTT², son of Peter and Gertrude Lott, died April 30, 1730; married Oct. 27, 1678, at the Dutch Reformed Church, New York, CORNELIA DE LA NOY, daughter of Abraham, who was of French extraction, and a resident of the city of New York.

Engelbart Lott, was settled at New Castle, on the west bank of the Delaware River, about thirty-five miles below Philadelphia. At the time of his marriage he owned a considerable tract of land and marsh on Christiana Creek, in New Castle County, and two lots in the town of New Castle. This property he continued to hold for several years subsequent to his removal to Long Island, but he eventually disposed of it by deed, Sept. 1, 1707, to Abraham Santford, John Harbadink, and Jane Tuttle. Toward the close of the year 1682, New Castle, with the adjacent territory, became united with the Province of Pennsylvania, under William Penn. Shortly after this union was affected, he took the Oath of Allegiance and promising fidelity and lawful obedience to William Penn, the Proprietor and Governor of that province, in compliance with an act passed at Chester at the Colonial Legislature of Pennsylvania.

He was on terms of intimacy and friendship with Gov. Penn, who held out strong inducements for him to remain at New Castle; but the unhealthiness of the place and surrounding country, together with an ejectment suit which had been several years pending before the Court of Sessions, then held at Gravesend, in the West Riding of Yorkshire, on Long Island, in which Derick Jansen Hoghlandt was plaintiff, and his father, Peter Lott, defendant, caused him to remove.

In 1682, with his wife Cornelia, he came to Flatbush, on Long Island, with a view to make it his permanent residence, and purchased a house and about two acres of land situated on the easterly side of the road and a short distance south of the Erasmus Hall Academy, near the property of Teunis G. Bergen. In the month of December, in the same year of his removal, he and his wife Cornelia were admitted on certificate, as members in full communion of the Reformed Dutch Church of Flatbush, then under the pastoral charge of the Rev. Casparus Van Zuren.

In 1688 he hired for farming purposes from the church of Flatbush a tract of land situated on the south side of the road leading to New Lots, and north of the land of John Stryker, with the salt meadows thereto appertaining, for the term of seven years, at the yearly rent of 225 guilders, payable in sewant, or in wheat, to be delivered at Brooklyn Ferry at the current price. In 1709 he disposed of his house and two acres of land, and purchased from Daniel Polhemus and Neltje, his wife, the southerly one-third part of the farm of the Rev. Johannes Theodorus Polhemus, the first minister of the Reformed Dutch Churches in Kings county. In 1698 he was appointed High Sheriff of the county of Kings by Richard, Earl of Bellomont, Governor of the Province of New York. He lived on his farm until the time of his death, in 1730. Signed his name "Engel Bart Lott." (Ref: 28:191; 48:183/4)

n7. Bergen says he had a daughter Elizabeth, bapt. March 12, 1715, married Jacobus Pieter Snyder.

As this baptism took place in the Reformed Dutch Church, Port Richmond, S.I., where Engelbert, son of Bartel resided, she was undoubtedly this latter Engelbert's daughter.

n8. This Peter Lott, Bergen in his Kings county settlers, says married Nishe, and moved to Hopewell, N.J. However, in view of the fact, that both Peter and his wife, Nishe, appear as adults in the 1698 Census of Hempstead, L.I., Bergen was mistaken in identity. This he corrected in his later work "Descendants of Hans Bergen," page 11, in which he states, the above Peter, "probably died young."

5. ABRAHAM LOTT², son of Peter and Gertrude Lott, died in 1766. Married 1st CLAESJE LANGSTRAET, born 1672, daughter of Derick Stoffelsz Langestraat, who emigrated in 1657 and Catharina Van Lieuwin (Van Leuven) his wife. Johanna Havens, widow of Johannis Holsaert was the 2nd wife of Derick Langestraat, and the one who was a sponsor at Jan Lott's baptism 1696.

Abraham Lott married 2nd GEERTJE JANS DORLANDT. (In printed works this date is given as Aug. 2, 1695, but there must be a mistake in transcribing the Church Records.) She was born in Bedford, baptized Aug. 19, 1674, Reformed Dutch Church, Brooklyn, N.Y. Married 3rd, SARA; and married 4th MARYTIE. Had issue by all four wives, the dates run consecutively, and all are named in his will.

Credit is due Mr. Austin C. Graybeal, of Des Moines, Iowa, for having worked out this puzzle of the various Abraham Lotts. Quoting his letter to me of April 3, 1941:-

"Abraham Lott lived in Brooklyn after his marriage to Claesie Langstraet, for here on the Brooklyn Church records we find the following, April 25, 1696, Abraham Lott, Claesje Langstraet had Jan Lott. Sponsors Dirk Langstraet and Johanna Havens (his wife). Peter Lott of New York bapt. Oct. 31, 1697, at Jamaica, was a son of Abraham and Claesje Lott. The records show that Abraham moved to Jamaica where his brother Hendrick lived just before this last date.

"Isaac Lott, 1704, was a son of Abraham and his 2nd wife Geertje. This appears to be their only child. Abraham Lott must have married his third wife Sara, between Isaac's birth 1704, and Jacob's birth 1716. Between 1716 and 1718, he had again married for a fourth time, Maria or Marytie, as his last three children were born 1718-20-22.

"The Dutch Reformed Church, Brooklyn, marriages gives Aug. 2, 1695, as the date of Abram Lott's marriage to Geertje Jans Dorlandt. This date is what is wrong, many errors appear in the copies of the early records. If it read 1699, everything would check."

Abraham Lott, made his will July 21, 1760, stating he was "far advanced in age." it was proved Sept. 4, 1766, and reads in abstract as follows:-

1760. July 21. In the Name of God, Amen, I, Abraham Lott, of Jamaica, in Queens County, being in perfect health, but far advanced in age, and considering that I have but a short time to continue in this transitory life. I leave to my son, Rem Lott, all my horses, wagons, ploughs, and all my carpenter tools; also all my lands, meadows, and messuages in Jamaica or elsewhere; And he is to provide me a comfortable maintainance during my natural life, and he is to pay to the rest of my children £504. as follows: To my daughter Charity, now wife of Nicholas Van Arsdalen, of Jamaica, L.I., 72 pounds; to my son Hendrick, 72 pounds; to my son Jacob, 72 pounds, to my son, Isaac, 72 pounds; to my three grandchildren, the children of my deceased son, Abraham, viz: Abraham Motije, and Cornelius, 72 pounds; to my son, John, 72 pounds. Residue and remaining part of said 504£ to son Peter. All the rest of my estate, I leave to my children. I make my sons, Peter, John and Rem, Executors.

His will reads as follows:

1728. April 15. In the Name of God, Amen. I, Hendrick Lodt, of Newtowne in Queens county, Yeoman, being sick. All debts to be paid - I leave to my wife Catrina all the land and meadow belonging to me in Kings county with all appurtenances - the present plantation on which I dwell, and which I bought of Richard Scudder, lying and being in the bounds of Newtown, and all my personal estate of every kind soever to her during her widowhood.

I leave to my son Peter Lodt my trooping horse pistols and holster and carbine for his right of first born. I leave to my sons Peter and Johannes all my lands and Meadows in Newtown and all my lands in Jamaica after their mother's decease or marriage, and all my lands and meadows in Kings county and they are to pay their sister Dorothy, wife of William Remsen, Gertruyt, wife of Andries Onderdonck, and Mary £100 each within three years after they come in possession.

All my lands in Nova Caesaria (New Jersey), and all the rest of my estate I leave to my children. I make my wife and sons, Executors.

At his father's death he became the owner of his father's farm, which he had previously cultivated. This farm was by him afterward devised to his son, Jacobus Lott, who held it during his lifetime, and upon his death it was sold to Hendrick Suydam, and is now in possession (1909) of Sarah Suydam, the wife of John Ditmas.

In May 1730, Abraham Lott obtained by purchase from the widow and children of Daniel Polhemus then deceased, the northerly two thirds parts of the Polhemus farm, and by this purchase, with the previous devise to him of his father's farm, he became possessed of all the land, woodland, and meadows originally patented by Gov. Stuyvesant to the Rev. Johannes Theodorus Polhemus.

In the year 1743 he was elected a Representative from the county of Kings in the Colonial Legislature of New York, and served in that capacity one legislative term of seven years, and upon his re-election commenced another term, but did not live to see its termination. And she is to have firewood and fencing out of my wood land in Newtown and hay from my meadow in Flatbush, and one third of my orchard that joins my dwelling house. But if she happens to marry then my executors are to take possession of the estate for the children.

He mentions children, Hendrick, Mauris, Catharine, Annetje, Maria, and Peter. He leaves to his sons Hendrick and Mauris all his lands in Flatbush and Newtown, and they are to pay to their sisters £600 each. He leaves to his son Pieter Lott all his farms in the town of Boswyck (Bushwick). Makes his brother, Johannes Lott, and his brother-in-law Rem Remsen and Andries Onderdonk, Executors.

Johannes Lott was a man of much wealth and influence in his community. He was himself witness to the will of Stephen Schenck of Flatlands, dated June 7, 1758, with Peter Wyckoff and Peter Stryker. Caspar Springsteen, in his will,

Nov. 8, 1723, directs his son Joris to pay balance on two bonds to Gertry and Johannes Lott, Gertruy being sister of Johannes. Johannes Lott, as per New York Civil List, was a member of the Assembly from 1727 to 1757.

In the list of titles in Kings county court house is the following abstract: "Coert Voorhees on Dec. 12, 1719 sells to Johannes Lott for £2100 a certain tract of land which said Voorhees on June 10, 1711 had transferred to him from Roeloff and Albert Terhune. This piece of property passed through several hands before coming to Voorhees belonging formerly to heirs of Garret Coert who had a title for the same from Coert Stevense in October 1699, who had on Oct. 8, 1687, purchased the same from Abram Jorris." This is the property where Mr. John B. Lott and Andrew H. Suydam, resided in 1910, and is known as the Hendrick I. Lott homestead built in 1800. Here Johannes Lott resided during life, where most of his children were born and his family reared. He acquired two other farms by purchase making an extensive estate at his death. He was owner of a portion of Barren Island and land east of the Stromkill or Garretson's creek, and west of Mill Island, and north of Barren Island. Barren Island was originally owned by the Indians, who sold the same to John Tilton Sr., and Samuel Spicer.

The will of Johannes Lott is quaint and original:- "In the Name of God Amen. I, Johannes Lott of the township of Flatlands in Kings county 'Yeoman' knowing that it behoveth every man to set his worldly estate in such order if possible before he departeth this life, that no strife or debate may arise about the same. All debts to be paid.

I leave to my son Johannes all that certain messuage dwelling house and farm or tract of land and meadow in Flatlands bounded as follows: Beginning at the eastermost corner of the land of Joost Wyckoff and from thence running with a straight line to a certain ditch in the meadow near a small island so called on the west side of a small sand bridge upon said ditch and from thence running easterly along the ditch to the bay thence along the bay until it comes to a certain creek called 'Stroomkill' from thence along the said 'Stroomkill' to the bounds of the land which was purchased by me of Peter Wyckoff and so along the said bounds until it comes to the southermost corner of the land of Joose Wyckoff, and from thence along the same to beginning.

Also one-half of a certain tract of woodland in Flatlands in the "Neck" so called which was purchased by me from the heirs of Martin Schenck the whole being 41 acres and bounded east by the "Long Vly" so called, west by the division line south by Johannes Lott and north by woodland of the estate of Dominicus Vanderveer, being the south half.

Also a lot of meadow land in Flatlands at a place called "Freezenhook," bounded west by a lot of meadow of Dirck Remsen east by a lot of Meadow of my own, it being one of the lots bought of Peter Wyckoff.

I leave to my son Petrus all that tract of land and meadow in Flatlands beginning at the east corner of the land of Joost Wyckoff and thence northeast along the fence until it comes to the bounds between me and William Stoothoff and thence along said bounds to the (nl0) Bay and so

n10. Johannes Lott³ purchased one-half the undivided right of Barren Island of Wilhelmus Stoothoof, and by his last will and testament dated April 20, 1771, gives the land, meadows, marshes, etc., which he bought of said Stoothoof to his three sons namely Johannes, Petrus and Jeromus Lott in Equal shares.

along the bay to a certain ditch near an island and so west along the ditch to the west side of a small sand bridge aforesaid and from thence to the beginning and adjoining the land and meadow I have given to my son Johannes. To the daughter of my son Joris (deceased) viz: Jannetje wife of Nicholas Cowenhoven £550.

To Maria the daughter of my grandson Johannes (deceased) who was the son of my son Joris $\pounds550$.

I leave to the children of my daughter Catrina, late wife of Dirck Remsen viz: Johannes and Dirck £1,000.

To my grandson Johannes Lott son of my son Hendrick (deceased) £5. for his birthright. All the rest of my estate to my children and grandchildren above mentioned.

I make my sons Johannes, Petrus and Jeromus Executors.

Petrus Lott willed his share to his son John P. Lott who gave it to his two sons John and Samuel, both who sold their share to Dilworth and Voorhees.

It is believed that Henry Lott, married a second time, a Catharine (Kroesen) Jones, widow, through the courtesy of Mr. Orville Corson, Middletown, Ohio, we give the following letter to him, from Mr. Frank K. Swain, Fonthill, Doylestown, Pa.:-

"....you ask would it have been possible that Henry Lott's first wife was a Kroesen? I cannot answer this - Mercy is not a Krewson name. According to your book Mercy died Nov. 25, 1747, and I found Benjamin Jones died Dec. ?, 1748.

"This left Henry Lott, widower and Catharine Kroeson Jones, widow, free to marry, which they did, because in a petition of the Jones heirs, in Feb. 26, 1785, speaking of their father's estate, say: 'And whereas the said Catharine Jones, widow of the Testator having again intermarried with a certain Henry Lott, afterwards died without making any last will and testament.' etc.

"They were asking to have the farm disposed of and the money divided among the Jones children. This could not have been done before the death of Catharine Krewson Jones Lott. Several of her Jones children were already dead and I feel sure the petition was made directly after her death say about Jan. 1785, so as to settle this long drawn out estate (37 years) which she had the use of as long as she lived.

"If she married again she had the right to choose one of Benjamin Jones' farms as her own. As no mention is made of the 250 acres she received from her father Derrick, she must have chosen that tract and disposed of it soon after her marriage with Henry Lott, as her niece Elizabeth Kroeson and husband John Vanartsdalen owned it as early as 1756. Henry Lott was a witness to several Kroeson wills and deeds. If Catharine Jones Lott died say 1785, and Henry Lott died Dec. 21, 1784, the whole thing knits together. Why he did not mention her in his will I cannot

see. She was rich herself and that may be the reason, or she could have died first of course."

His residence is given as Moorland (meaning Moreland). Five shillings were conveyed to each of the children of his son Peter and his daughter Mary. The remainder was divided equally among his other children: Stephen, Henry, Zephaniah, Leonard, and Letitia Carter. Daughter Letitia's share was to be held in trust, she to receive the interest and after her death her share was to be given to her daughter Prudy, wife of Daniel Courson. The Executors were: Zephaniah Lott, Stephen Lott, and Daniel Corsen.

He commenced a mercantile business in the city of New York which he carried on for many years. He occasionally officiated as Clerk of the Colonial Assembly, and was subsequently appointed Treasurer of the Colony of New York, Dec. 12, 1767, which office he held until the year 1776. Both Abraham and Abraham P. Lott, were April 13, 1784, members of the Chamber of Commerce, when it was incorporated by the New York Legislature, after the British evacuation. (nl3)

The Abraham Lotts have been confused, as to identity, and a careful examination of their various records show the following:-

Abraham Lott (?Baker, North Ward) son of Pieter and Femmetje (Remsen) Lott, was bapt. Sept. 5, 1722; m. lst Cornelia Rapalje; m. 2nd May 8, 1751, Jannetje Goelet, who d. Jan. 2, 1792. Abraham Lott, Oct. 4, 1743, Freeman, New York City; Sept. 2, 1744, bapt. Pieter, son of Abraham Lot and Cornelia Rapalje. Sponsors: Pieter Lott, Femmetje Remsen, syn h v; Feb. 1, 1747, bapt. Joris, son of Abraham Lott and Cornelia Rappelje; Feb. 5, 1752, bapt. Philippus, son of Abraham Lott and Jannetje. Sponsors: Do Anthonius Curtenius, Catharina Boelen z h v; May 23, 1753, bapt. Femmetje, dau. of Abraham Lott and Jannetje Goelet. Sponsors: Pieter Lott, Femmetje Remsen z huis v; Aug. 25, 1756, bapt. Pieter, son of Abraham Lott and Jannetje Goelet. Sponsors: Isaac Goelet, Catharina Goelet huis vv Petrus Curtenius.

Mr. Howard S. F. Randolph, in his article (N.Y.G. and B. 72:281) is mistaken when he says it was Col. Abraham P. Lott, who married Jannetje Goelet, because Abraham P. Lott, is shown in land transactions, and church records, as having wife Maria (Mary) Aalstyn, during the period 1765 to 1775. I believe that Col. Abraham P. Lott, was son of Abraham #46 by a lst wife, but have not placed him as such, pending further proof. Hendrick I, and his brother Johannes I, were both sons of Johannes. There are other instances in the Lott family of the use of initials, and names

from the maternal side, and at variance with the time honored custom of the Dutch naming system. Col. Abraham P. Lott's middle initial may stand for Philip, as he named his only son by that name. Jan. 27, 1765, Maria (Mary) Aalstyn appears as sponsor "h v Abm Lott"; Dec. 30, 1770, Abraham P. Lott and Maria Aalstyn z h v sponsors at the bapt. of Jane, dau, of Pieter T. Curtenius and Catharine Goelet; Jan. 30, 1772. Abraham P. Lott, Mary his wife, convey to Isaac Roosevelt; in 1775, he was appointed Colonel of the 3rd N.Y. City Regt. (Mil. Ret.) Delegate to the 3rd and 4th Provl Congresses; Member of Assembly 1777, 8, 9, 1780, 1, 2, 3. In 1783 he joined in an address to Gov. Clinton and Geo. Washington; 1786, Abraham P. Lott Esq., Alderman. Maiden-Lane (this man resided in the West Ward) Member of the Gen. Soc. Mechanics and Tradesmen; May 3, 1790 Abraham P. Lott conveys to Rev. Isaac Blauvelt, of Fishkill, "son-in-law" property which was "in trust" to Abm P. Lott. He died Feb. 26, 1794, buried Dutch Church. His will made April 8, 1793 (unrecorded) names, son Philip and his wife Mary. Grandson Peter Lott. Dau. Phebe (deceased) wife of Rev. Isaac Blauvelt, and grandsons Abraham and Timothy Blauvelt. Mentions his "lands in Coeyman's Patent" and "mortgage on same made by Abraham Lott and his wife Gertrude, to said Abraham P. Lott." Col. Abraham P. Lott is closely identified in all records with the family of Abraham and Gertrude (Coeyman) Lott, as well as with all the Coeyman connections through Gertrude's brothers, sisters, their wives and husbands.

His son Philip Lott was 3rd Lieut. of the Rangers, Revolutionary War. Married Sept. 12, 1774, Mary Kearney, of Monmouth Co., N.J.; Aug. 6, 1775, bapt. Son Peter, Sponsors: Abraham P. Lott, Mary Aalsteun z h v; May 28, 1784, bapt. (b. June 27) Jane Goelet. Sponsors: Andrew Lott and Else Lott; June 1, 1786, bapt. (b. June 25) Phoebe. Sponsors: Abraham P. Lott, Catherine Curtenius. nl5.

his father's lifetime, and upon the death of his father he became the owner thereof. He was at one time the principal land surveyor in Kings county and also held
the office of one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in the county. During his lifetime he conveyed to his son, Johannes E. Lott, his farm in Flatlands,
which he, with his father, had purchased of Aert Willemse, and by his last will
and testament devised to his son Johannes E., the residue of his real estate.

His sons Abraham E. Lott and Engelbert Lott, were merchants in New York, and continued the mercantile business until the commencement of hostilities between this country and Great Britain in 1776, and returned to Flatbush a few months previous to the landing of British forces under General Howe the greater part of the inhabitants of Flatbush left their homes and went into Queens county. In the flight Abraham E. and Engelbert Lott were pursued and overtaken in Flushing. Engelbert was taken prisoner and brought back to Flatbush, then in possession of the British Army, and confined in the Flatbush church, but was soon set at liberty on his parole. He remained in Flatbush and attended to the public business of the town and county, and was occasionally engaged in surveying and conveyancing. While engaged on business at the tavern of Dr. Hendrick Van Beuren, he was suddenly attacked with apoplexy, and died there, Nov. 29, 1779, in the 26th year of his age, and only twelve days after the death of his father.

Abraham E. Lott, the remaining brother, escaped from his pursuers by secreting himself in a cornfield, and when they had abandoned their search he went to the shore and crossed Long Island Sound to the Westchester side. Thence he proceeded through the city of New York, and, on his journey meeting with the late Elkanah Watson, they both went south to Edenton, N.C. At that place he carried on the mercantile business under the firm of Lott and Payne. After the termination of the war he was about making preparations to leave Edenton for New York, but was suddenly cut off by death before his designs were accomplished. He died in Edenton, N.C. at the house of Mr. John Green, March 4, 1785, in the 37th year of his age. (Ref: 48:185/6)



A place of honor should be given to the late LOLA LOTT for her efforts in making the Lott Monument possible, also the late LIZZIE (LOTT) BOYER, for her work in collecting Adams County Lott History, which we hope descendants of this branch will publish, in the near future. the sum of 125 £, 25 s, be paid unto Cornelius Lott for hiring and paying men to collect Iron and Brick belonging to the County found after the Court-House was burned by the enemy. Also 14 £, 8 s, 9 d, for sundry smithwork done to repair Court-House. (Ref: 78:570)

1783. After the war the Millstone Consistory felt the need of repairing the Millstone Church. They had suffered much from raids and depredations of the enemy. They appointed a Committee consisting of Rev. Froleigh, Capt. Cornelius Lott, and Peter Dirmarse to visit Long Island and solicit help. Among those giving were Jacobus Lott, 10 s; Jeromus Lott, 1 £, 4 s; Petrus Lott, 1 £ 17 s; Johannes Lott 1 £, 17 s, 4 d; and many others.

Capt. Cornelius Lott was a Lieutenant in Capt. Conrad Ten Eyck's Company, 2nd Battalion, Somerset county, N.J., and was later promoted Captain. (D.A.R. V124:139) Inscription from the Lott Monument, below: (nl5)

"In perpetuation of the memory of Cornelius Lott, 1738-1816, and his wife Henrietta Brokaw, 1739-1829, both of whom lie buried in Millstone Churchyard, Somerset County, New Jersey. Ditmas, who edited "Historic Homesteads of Kings County," seems to be in doubt of the Johannes who was in the service. It was Johannes Jr., as the elder Johannes would have been too old to enter this war. He was the owner of large tracts of land at Flatlands, as per his will dated Jan. 24, 1782, the day previous to his death in New Lots, Flatbush. When it was that Johannes removed his family to New Lots (Flatbush) is not definitely known, but it must have been a short time previous to his decease. His children resided at New Lots several years after his death; the three sons, Jurian, Johannes and Christopher, conveyed their shares of the Flatlands property to Hendrick I. He resided in Flatlands all his life, and received a large share of his father's estate, also £ 1,750, sterling, in his father's will. Jeromus Lott followed farming, and was an influential citizen in his community. He was a member of the Flatlands Reformed Dutch Church. His will is as follows:-

In the Name of God, Amen. I, Jeromus Lott, of Flatlands, in Kings county, being of sound mind and memory, though weak in body.

I leave to my son Jeromus Lott, all that tract of land in Flatlands, bounded northwest by the highway that leads from Flatlands to Gravesend, southwest by the land of Albert Terhune, east partly by my land and partly by land of Joose Wyckoff, south by land of Joose Wyckoff, and east partly by the road that leads from Joose Wyckoff's gate to Flatlands town, containing 62 acres. Also a piece of woodland in Flatlands, in the Neck, so called, bounded southwest by the division line, northwest by land of Folkert Sprong, northeast by land of Garrit Stryker, and southwest by

land of Gerrit Stoothoff, containing 17 acres. Also a tract of meadow in Flatlands, and the west side of Bergen's Island, bounded southwest by Martinsen's mill pond. Also a piece of meadow in Flatlands at a place called Varker's Hook, bounded southwest by Bestover Kill. I also leave to him one-third of all my right in the undivided lands in the Patent of Andries Buddle and Wolphert Garrisen and in the Patent of Flatlands. And my son Johannes is to pay to my executors the sum of £500, when he is 24 years of age. And whereas I have made preparations for building a barn on the said lands, it is to be finished.

I leave to my son Jeromus Lott, a tract of land and meadow in Flatlands, bounded southeast by land of Johannes P. Lott, southwest by land of Joose Wyckoff. Also a tract of woodland in Flatlands in the Neck, etc.

He married LETITIA PHILLIPS, who was living in 1788, daughter of Justice John and Anna (Lot, Lott) Phillips. (See #110)

Richard was named Executor of his brother Peter Lott's will, July 24, 1762. In 1764. Feb. 19, he was named one of the Executors of his Father's will. Richard Lott served as Lieut.-Colonel 1776/7, 2nd Regiment, Middlesex county, N.J. Militia, in the Revolutionary War.

His son Theophilus Lott, never married, his will is of particular interest. as it disposes of his Father's property as follows:-

In the Name of God, Amen. I, Theophilus Lott, of the Township of Hopewell, County of Hunterdon and Western Division of the State of New Jersey. Yeoman and a Miller, being of perfect mind and memory this 20th day of December in the year of Our Lord 1786, thanks be to the disposer of all things. Therefore Calling to Mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that I once must die, and touching such Worldly Estate as it has pleased God to Bless me with in this Life. I give and dispose of it in the following manner.

Imprimis: It is my Will and order that all my just Debts charges be first paid and discharged out of my movable Estate by my Executors hereafter named:-

Item: I give and Devise to my Brother Peter the Grist-Mill and Saw Mill and the Dwelling House Standing below the Hill between the Mill race and the Creek. Also a piece or tract of Land Surrounding them contained in the following Dimentions or Boundaries be the same more or less. Viz: A line at the upper end farthest from the River to run on the Mill dam beginning at that end of the dam farthest from the line betwixt me and Jediah Scudder and to run in a Straight direction when it leaves the dam unto the sd line betwixt me and sd Scudder. Then a line to begin in the same place where the former one begins and run down the Mill race on the Side farthest from the Creek so as to include the race running thus till it comes directly before the Front of the new house on the hill, then to make a Square tack or corner and ascend the hill So far as to be just halfway betwixt the old house and the new one, then to make another corner or tack and run in a Straight course from thence halfway betwixt the Mill and the New house down to the edge or Border of the low land from thence up the Easterly side of low land, thence across the low land down to the River Delaware also the priveledge at any time of raising sufficient head of Water at the above sd mill dam for the use and Benefit of the Mills, also a Brown Ball Holse, and a fishing Sean, to him his Heirs and Assigns forever.

Item: I give and devise to my Sister Hannah a young roan mare.

Item: I give and Devise to my sisters Hannah and Jane two cows each of them one to be kept on the Farm and the Sole privelege of the Backroom to live in and the following - Necessaries yearly - Viz: a sufficiency of Fire Wood cut and hauled to the Door and fires made for them, thirty Pound of Flaz i.e. fifteen pound to each to be found and provided for them as long as they remain unmarried and no longer, by my Brother Richard, all these priveleges ceasing upon marriage day.

Item: I give and Devise to my Brother Richard all the Residue and remainder part of my Estate both real and personal, to him his heirs and assigns forever, he paying out of it the Legacies which I by my Father's will was enjoined to pay And I do hereby constitute, make and ordain my Brother Richard and my Brother Peter to be my joint Executors, to this my last will and Testament utterly disallowing revoking and disannulling all and every other will by me made before, Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.

Hendrick I. Lott and his three brothers were equal in the distribution of their father's estate, but on May 2, 1793, Jurrian Lott, Johannes I. Lott, and Christopher Lott and wife Elizabeth, all of New Lots, in the township of Flatbush, remissed, released and quit-claimed to their brother, Hendrick I. Lott, their shares.

The Hendrick I. Lott Historic Homestead, was erected in 1800. Charles Andrew Ditmas, a Lott Descendant, in his "Historic Homes of Kings County," pages 37/41, describes it as follows:-

"Extending from Kings Highway south is a level stretch of fertile land which reaches to the bay. On the west of it is the Strome Kil, now called Garretson's Creek and Mill Pond, and on the east it is divided by Flatbush Ave.. from the eastern part of town. All this land at one time was owned

by two families, namely, the Lotts and Wyckoffs. Embracing fine soil, it was no wonder that these people were able to acquire land holdings and occupy prominent positions in the town.

"About 200 feet west of Flatbush Ave., on the Kings Highway, is a road which in early times was called the Road to Lott's Landing, later degenerating into Lott's Lane, and now called on all authorized maps Kimball's Road. Halfway down this land to Lott's Landing, now a thriving fishing village called Hemlock City, stands a stately Mansion, which at one time in its history was the finest country house in King's county. Here, in the early part of the century, the people of the city drove to see the house and the well laid-out grounds, which were kept in a perfect state of cultivation."

"Johannes Lott³, purchased the farm, of which this house was the homestead in 1719. He lived and died on this farm, adding to it by purchase until on his leath he owned three farms in Flatlands, one of which he left to each of his three surviving sons, Hendrick I. Lott and his wife, living for a time in the old Flatlands Homestead, which stood at the side of the present house and close to Lott's Lane. In 1800 they built the present structure and moved in, and then they moved the dining room and kitchen wing of the old house up to the side of the new house, and made them fast. Thus the right wing, as you look at the picture, is a part of the old house, dating back perhaps more than two centuries. There was a formal Dutch garden in the front of the house, and the place was well fenced."

Here it was that Hendrick I. Lott reared his family, and where he passed the greater part of his life. During his last years he and his wife resided with Dr. Adrian Vanderveer, at Flatbush, where he died. He and his wife are buried in the old burial ground of the Dutch Church at Flatbush.

His wife, Mary Brownjohn, sister of his brother Christopher's wife Elizabeth, was a most capable and energetic woman and reared her children in the paths of righteousness. Her father, Dr. Thomas Brownjohn, and his father, Dr. William Brownjohn, were eminent physicians at New York. Dr. Thomas Brownjohn resided at the corner of Wall and Water Streets, and was a large property holder. Dr. William Brownjohn, his father was a prominent factor during the Revolution, and the family tradition is that the window leads or weights were melted for bullets for the Rebel Army. (Ref: 1VI:182/4)

This was his chosen occupation through life. He was honest, industrious and frugal, and lived the useful life in his community. He was an owner of slaves, but, owing to the Manumission Act, slaves were freed prior to 1835. The inventory of George Lott's, of Flatbush, personal estate, dated March 11, 1835, amounted to \$4,164.79 and names many quaint articles in common use at that time.

He and his wife Wilhelmina were devoted members of the old Reformed flock of Flatlands. She was a most capable and energetic woman, possessing a strong mind of her own. In her affairs she showed much business tact and conducted her farm with exactness and profit. In the latter part of her life she became an invalid. (Ref: 1VI:184/5)



Jeremiah Lott, at the age of twenty years commenced the business of land Surveying and Conveyancing, which he followed for about thirty-five years and was at one time, the only county surveyor. In 1801, he was appointed Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kings, and held that appointment uninterruptedly for a period of forty-two years. In the year 1814 he was the member of Assembly representing Kings County in the State Legislature. In the years, 1821, 1822, and 1839, he served in the same capacity. He held the office of Surrogate to which he was appointed in the year 1814, successively for the period of nineteen years. In the War of 1812, with Great Britain, he held a Captain's Commission in the Flatbush Company of Militia. In September 1814, he was called with his company into the United States service under Brigadier-General Johnson, and stationed at Fort Greene, in Brooklyn. During this time he lived on and cultivated the farm in Flatbush on which he lived, and which was devised to him by his father, Johannes E. He enlisted in Company "K" 61st Ohio Infantry on Jan. 2, 1862. Age given as 45 (correct age nearly 58) in order to qualify. He fought under General Meade in the Battle of Gettysburg. This place was the scene of his birthplace and he had lived in this locality until 1834. Part of the Battle was on the old Lott farmhouse it was here that he met his brother Jacob whom he hadn't seen for many years. He had five sons in service.

Mr. Graybeal writes:- "Just a line of explanation regarding my grandfather Isaac Lott. From the outline I gave you he appears to have been quite a roamer, but he was one of the early pioneers in this part of the country and when a new territory was opened up he wanted to be in the rush more for the enjoyment than anything else.

"When a young man he was a freighter with a wagon train over the mountains of Pennsylvania, assisting emigrants to the new country of Ohio, and providing them with provisions. Later he moved his family to the end of his trails, which at this time was in Seneca and Wyandotte Counties, Ohio. He lived here for several years having a family of thirteen children. In the war of 1861 he was one of the first to volunteer. After the close of the war he came to Iowa which was rapidly being settled at that time, then later on to Nebraska which was opened to Homesteaders. He lived near some of his sons who took claims in this new country. As this was far from any woodland, they built sod houses to live in. Twisted grass for fuel to keep them warm in the winter, then when summer came and their crops looked very promising, along came the grasshoppers and devoured everything in sight. Such was the life of the Pioneer, they were a sturdy people and were always looking ahead for better things in life.

"Isaac was nearly 79 years of age when he suddenly passed away. His son Henry Lott, whom he hadn't seen for years came from his home in Pennsylvania to visit with him. This was in the spring of the year and the roads were to muddy for team and wagon, so they walked to the nearest village. After a five mile tramp through the heavy soil and the excitement of meeting his son, proved too

much for him to stand. He collapsed just before reaching his journeys end. At this time he was making his home with my mother (Mrs. Graybeal), so this story was often told me when I was a child."

Excerpt from a letter of his son George W. Lott, Nov. 2, 1917:- "I do not know of any high or special mark he made in life, (speaking of Isaac Lotte) but he was a man that everyone liked, always honest and prompt in his dealings and a man of very good judgement. He was a very strong man, and in his younger days freighted with large wagons over the mountains through Pennsylvania."

"When settlers came to a new country, one of the first things to do was to organize a school for their children and a place of worship for their families. The Old Stone Indian Mission located at Upper Sandusky, was where my Mother and her brothers and sisters went to Sunday School. (I have a large drawing in colors of this old church. It was the first mission of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and has a very interesting story connected with it.) If you ever sat at the old Lott table you would find that the PROVIDER was never forgotten."

RES:- Adams Co., Pa.; emigrated 1st to Seneca County, Ohio. Moved to Upper Sandusky, Wyandotte Co., Ohio, about 1834; came to Polk county, Iowa at the close of the Civil War 1869, later living in Adair County, Iowa before going to a homestead in Butler County, Nebraska. His daughter (later wife of William Walter) returned to the farm on the second day of the Battle and cooked for the Confederate wounded. Also at night, she slipped food to the Federate prisoners.

Jacob was a staunch patriot. Five of his sons were in the Federate Army, one son, Cornelius Lott, being killed in action.

Hendrick I. Lott of Flatlands in consideration of the love and affection which he has towards his son Johannes H. Lott and one dollar lawful money, conveye to said Johannes H. Lott All that certain tract or parcel of land, meadows, marshes and beaches on the island commonly called Barren Island, in town of Flatlands, bounded southerly by Atlantic Ocean, easterly by land meadow, march beach of Peter and George Voorhees, etc.

He also on same date conveys the same right to the children of Johannes H. Lott - Jane B., Henry D., Mary, Catherine Ann, Eliza, Simon B., and Jurian Lott.

Johannes H. Lott possessed 104 acres of upland and about 140 acres of meadow land, besides land on Barren Island. He was a man of strict habits,

charitable in his nature and strong in his principles. He was a Democrat of the old School. He died instestate, and his son, Henry De Witt Lott, was granted Letters of Administration of his estate. Nelson Shaw and Mary his wife, March 15, 1836, sell to Johannes H. Lott in consideration of the sum of \$350, their ownership of Barren Island.

Gashe (Bergen) Lott, his wife, was loved and respected by all who knew her, as a lady of refinement and culture, whose kindly disposition led to the love of her numerous descendants. (Ref: 1VI:185/6; 4:335)

His early education was gained in the district school of his native town, supplemented by a course in the academy at Fairfield, Conn., until the age of seventeen years. From a youth he assisted his father in the work of the farm, and on the death of his father he took up farming on the homestead place belonging to his mother, until he was united in marriage in 1839, when he and his wife settled on the farm left by his father. Mr. Lott followed his chosen occupation in this spot until 1874, when he retired from active life. He was progressive in the affairs of the farm, and made his seventy acres yield a handsome yearly income. He believed in improved ideas of agriculture and his farm compared favorably with the best in the region. He was successful as a market gardener, cultivated the common crops, and found a ready market in New York where he supplied the Washington Market. Shortly after he gave up farming he went to live with his daughter, Mrs. John L. Bergen, then residing on the Highway at Flatlands.

He was a man of broad and liberal views, possessing high ideals, with unrelenting principles for right. He retained in a remarkable degree a large circle of friends, and was esteemed by all who knew him. He gave liberally to any worthy cause, particularly his church, and during the trying times of the Civil War aided the cause by his contributions. He and his wife were devoted members of the Reformed Dutch Church at Flatlands, where he served that body as one of its Deacons. In politics he was an old time Whig until the birth of the Republican party, when he became affiliated with the new principles, though he never sought public office. (Ref: 1VI:187)

George Lott's elementary educational training was limited to the nearby district school, supplemented by a course in a private school at Princeton, N.J. After completing his schooling he subsequently returned to his mother's home and took up farming, the mother having erected a new homestead on property she inherited from Anne Terhune, an aunt. After the death of her husband, the Lott farm was leased to different individuals, David W. Preston being the final lessee, after which time Peter Lott, brother of George, took possession, George taking land on the north side of the highway. After the death of his mother in 1865, the property was divided between Peter and George, Jeromus, the third brother, having died in 1858. Twenty acres of the property on the south side of the highway George exchanged for a four-acre plot on Ocean Ave., in Flatbush, and in 1889 he erected a homestead on the south side of the highway known as Kings Highway and Nostrand Avenue. He was a progressive, up-to-date farmer and, like his brother Peter, believed in the best methods of agriculture. During the Civil War his farm was especially productive, and he received the highest prices at that period.

In personal respects he was a man of retired manner, a deep reader. He stood in high esteem with his neighbors, and was known for his strict principles of right, being greatly devoted to his church and family, and did much good in the community. He was a member of the Flatlands Reformed Dutch Church, with his wife, and served at one time as Elder, and was a liberal supporter of the church and a member of the Board of Publication of the Synod, also serving as a delegate to the Synod. In politics, he was in early years a Whig, but when the party changed to Republican he became affiliated with it. (Ref: 1VI:188/9)

Hon. John A. Lott graduated from Union College at the age of twenty and studied law in the office of Henry E. Werner, of New York. In 1835 he formed a partnership with Henry C. Murphy for the practice of law, and in 1836 Judge John Vanderbilt was admitted to the firm. The relations continued until 1857, when Mr. Lott was elected a Justice of the Supreme Court.

In April 13, 1838, Gov. Marcy appointed him as First Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, which office he held until Jan. 27, 1843. In 1841 he was elected a member of the Assembly for the year 1842, and in 1842 he was elected to succeed Gabriel Furman as Senator from the first district.

He served in this office from 1842 to Dec. 31, 1846, during which time he was looked upon as his party's leader in the Senate. In 1857 he was elected as a Justice of the Supreme Court, holding this office until 1862. In 1869 Judge Lott was elected an Associate Justice of the Court of Appeals, and in 1870 the Governor appointed him Chief Justice of the Commission of Appeals, which office he held until 1875, when the commission expired.

Judge Lott was the most distinguished member of Dutch lineage to occupy a judicial office in Kings County during the last century. He was noted for his

public spirit and was rarely absent from the banquets and meetings of the St. Nicholas Society. Few men ever held the confidence of the public as did Judge Lott. He was faithful to every public and private trust imposed upon him, and was mourned as one of Brooklyn's greatest sons. (Ref: 4:341; 48:158; 87:19/20)



He gained his education in the nearby district school and Erasmus Hall Academy at Flatbush. During his early minority he engaged with his father in the affairs of the farm, which became his chosen occupation. He was advanced in his ideas of agriculture, and his farm compared favorably with the best in the section. In 1880 his mother, then at an advanced age, and wishing her children to share equally in their deceased father's estate, a division of the property was made, Henry D. receiving his apportionate share of fifteen acres and the old homestead. He also leased a portion of his sister's share and continued at market gardening until his death. Large quantities of potatoes, cabbages, corn and other varieties were cultivated and sold in the New York market. Not alone was he successful in the affairs of his farm, but he was prominent in the affairs and business of his town. He was assessor for the town of Flatlands, and for many years served as school trustee, filling these offices with much credit. In political affiliation he was an old time Democrat, and in religion he and his wife were attendants of the old Dutch Reformed Church at Flatlands. He was a man of excellent qualities of mind and heart, honored and respected by all who knew him. His principles of temperance were always upheld, and his home ties were always the closest, being a kind and loving husband and father. He kept in touch with the affairs of the world at large through the current news of the day, and was deeply interested in the welfare and advancement of the affairs of his native town of Flatlands. His education was received in Erasmus Hall Academy up to eighteen years of age, and during his minority he was engaged with his father in the cultivation of the farm until his marriage. At this time, 1861, he began the propagation of ovsters from the seed or small oysters received from beds along the Connecticut shore. These were planted in Garretsen's mill pond, so called, a part of his property. He followed this occupation successfully until 1880, supplying the New York market. The quality and size of this product was considered the most excellent in the market at that time. In 1880 the estate of Johannes H. Lott was divided among the seven children, Simon B. Lott receiving fifteen acres of upland and forty acres of meadow. In 1892 he added eleven acres to his property by purchase from his sister. He found a ready market for all he cultivated, and was counted a successful farmer. In 1899 he disposed of this property, retiring from active engagements. His farm compared favorably with the best in the region. He believed in advanced methods of agriculture, and kept abreast of the times. In religion Mr. Lott was an attendant of the Flatlands Reformed Church, where Mrs. Lott was a member in full communion. In political affiliations he was a Democrat of the true type, though never accepted any public office. (Ref: IVI: 189/90)







Chauncey M. Depew was the son of Capt. Isaac Depew, and his father's family had been prominent in the lower Hudson Valley for five generations, being descended from Francois Du Puy, a Huguenot who came from Calais, France, and was among the first settlers in Bushwick, L.I., in 1661, and later settled in Rockland County, N.Y.

It would be impossible in the space here available to give an account of the career of Mr. Depew, whose long life was a succession of remarkable episodes and whose services to the nation and community were so varied and important. Beginning as a country lawyer in Peekskill, he rose to be the chief of the Law Dept. of the N.Y. Central R.R., and the many other rail corporations controlled by the Vanderbilt family, later being successively Vice President, President, and Chairman of the Board of many of them. In early life he was an assemblyman and Secretary of State of New York, but avoided other public office, even refusing to qualify as Minister to Japan after his nomination was confirmed by the Senate; until having reached the aim of his ambitions in professional and business life he became U.S. Senator in 1899, which office he held for 12 years. He was noted for his wit and brilliancy as an orator and possessed of a genial kindly spirit, Mr. Depew was universally beloved and respected. (Holland Society Yearbook (1928/9) 285/7)




